As the first Chief Nursing and Midwifery officer for South Africa – Dr Makhanya provides strategic leadership in the development and monitor implementation of National policies; guidelines norms and practice models to optimize nursing and midwifery contributions attainment of goals of population health agenda. Within this portfolio, her responsibility specific to nursing education practice and regulation relates to providing leadership in the development of national policy frameworks; harnessing intra and interprofessional collaboration to ensure that nursing education

Dr. Makhanya participates in the Global Forum for Human Resources for Health, Global Forum for Regulation and Credentialing of Health Professions and the Global forum for Government Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officers. She also represents South Africa in the East Central and Southern African College of Nursing (ECSACON)
